Dam Dim Tea Estate, Western Doors.

Doors or Duars region is the foothills of the East Himalaya connecting Bhutan. It is believed that the name has been derived from the word DWAR, locally meaning gateway, as there were 18 established entry points to Bhutan.

During British rule, several Tea Gardens were established in this region amidst forests and mountains. One such Tea Garden was established as Barrons Tea Estate in 1927, which later came to be known as Dam Dim, deriving its name from 'Dema Dema' as called by the Bhutanese and Tibetans. Prior to 1963, this estate was under the UK based James Finlay & Co. Ltd., which since 1976 was known as Tata Finlay Limited and then as Tata Tea.

These beautiful, virgin and wild landscapes became the centre of attraction for the tourists round the year. Towards the end of 2006, Tata Tea with the support of Help Tourism, an East Himalaya based ecotourism organization, converted the Tea Bungalow at Dam Dim Tea Estate for the tourists. For the visitors to the Sikkim, Darjeeling & Doors, Dam Dim Tea Estate is an ideal destination to experience an authentic British Colonial Planter's hospitality and also the true wilderness of Western Doors.



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
